Program Note:

Sinfonietta was my first large-scale work for orchestra, composed during my college years at Lawrence University. The four movements correspond to traditional notions of classical symphonic works: the first movement is bold, rhetorical and serious; the second is a playful scherzo; the third movement is slow and lyrical; the final movement is a culminating finale, capped-off by a funeral dirge in the tradition of Roy Harris and Shostakovich. Indeed, these two composers were very much on my mind as I composed, and their influence is pervasive and not-so-subtle.
